ORDER

Statement of the Case

This matter comes before the Office of Campaign Finance (OCF) upon an inquiry conducted by the Office of Campaign Finance which determined that Moore for the People Mayoral Committee for which Dennis Moore serves as treasurer failed to timely file on or before June 12, 2006 a June 10, 2006 Report of Receipts and Expenditures (June 10, 2006 Report), pursuant to D.C. Official Code §1-1102.06(a) (2001 Edition).

By Notice of Hearing, Statement of Violations and Order of Appearance dated June 21, 2006, OCF ordered Dennis Moore (hereinafter respondent candidate) to appear at a scheduled hearing on June 28, 2006 and show cause why Moore for the People Mayoral Committee (hereinafter respondent committee) should not be found in violation of the D.C. Campaign Finance Reform and Conflict of Interest Act of 1974, as amended by D.C. Official Code §§1-1101.01 et seq. (Act) and fined accordingly.

On June 28, 2006, respondent candidate appeared pro se; OCF was represented by Wesley Williams, Public Affairs Specialist with the Public Information and Records Management Division.

Summary of Evidence

Mr. Williams alleged that Moore for the People Mayoral Committee failed to timely file the statutorily required June 10, 2006 Report by June 12, 2006. Respondent candidate stated that the report in question was not timely filed because he was ill during the period that the report was due and he did not have anyone to assist him with the preparation and submission of the report. Respondent treasurer additionally stated that he submitted the report on June 14, 2006, immediately after he recovered from his illness.

Findings of Fact

Having reviewed the allegations and OCF records, I find:

1. Respondent committee was required to file a June 10, 2006 Report with OCF on or before June 12, 2006.
2. Respondent committee did not timely file a June 10, 2006 Report with OCF.
3. Respondent candidate submitted a June 10, 2006 to OCF on June 14, 2006.
4. Respondent candidate is a first time office seeker in the District of Columbia with no prior record with OCF.
5. Respondent committee is currently in compliance.

Conclusion of Law

Based upon the record and evidence, I therefore conclude:

1. Moore for the People Mayoral Committee violated D.C. Official Code Section 1-1105.05(a).
2. The penalty established at 3DCMR Sections 3711.2(f) and 3711.4 for failure to timely file a June 10, 2006 Report required by D.C. Official Code Section 1-1102.06(a) is a fine of \$50.00 per day for each business day subsequent to the due date.
3. In accordance with D.C. Official Code Section 1-1103.05(b)(3) and 3DCMR Sections 3711.2(f) and 3711.4, Moore for the People Mayoral Committee may be fined a maximum of \$100.00 for failing to timely file a June 10, 2006 Report.
4. For good cause shown pursuant to 3DCMR Section 3711.6, the Director of Campaign Finance (Director) may modify, rescind, dismiss or suspend any fine.
5. Respondent's candidate's status as a first time office seeker in the District of Columbia and compliance within two days of the due date provides good cause for suspension of the fine.

Recommendation

In view of the foregoing and information included in the case file, I hereby recommend that the Director suspend the fine that could be imposed in this matter.
